

HARDENHUISH SCHOOL BEHAVIOUR - YOUR CHOICES, YOUR CONSEQUENCES

Choices Consequences

- You demonstrate the Hardenhuish School Habits and choose to behave well in lessons.
- You put good levels of effort into your class work or homework and achieve good results.
- You volunteer to help staff or other pupils or you help look after our site and keep it tidy.
- You are not following the uniform expectations.
- You are eating in areas of the school where this is not allowed.
- You are chewing gum.
- You are not following the rules for games on the playground or field.
- You are being poorly behaved in the corridor (e.g. running or making lots of noise).
- You continue to disrupt the learning of others after being asked to stop (e.g. by chatting or calling out) or you are slow to cooperate with instructions or start work.
- You have not completed homework by the deadline or you have not brought the equipment needed.
- You are not following the phone expectations.
- You disrupt the learning of others after a NET Warning.
- You persistently make C1 behaviour choices (e.g. disruption or no homework) over a number of lessons.
- You have completed or lost your Conduct Card.
- Your behaviour is unsafe or you are heard using bad language.
- You are persistently late to school/lessons or truant.
- You are deliberately upsetting others.
- You persistently make C2 behaviour choices in spite of previous consequences.
- You physically assault another person.
- You are extremely rude to a member of staff.
- You do something that publicly harms the school's reputation.
 - You are in possession of certain items on our banned items list.











- Year 7 pupils will be given Merit stickers for their Merit Card.
- Year 8 to Year 11 pupils will be give ACE Points for achievement, citizenship or effort on SIMS. These are weighted with 1, 2 or 3 points depending on the amount of effort or the quality of work/behaviour demonstrated.
- Depending on the number of Merits/ACEs you receive, you may gain additional rewards.
- You will be asked to give your Conduct Card to a member of staff who
 will record this behaviour choice on there. (If the behaviour can be
 corrected, e.g. uniform altered, food put away or gum put in the bin,
 it should be. If the uniform can not be corrected in the same day, it
 will only be logged on the Conduct Card once).
- If your Conduct Card gets filled by 5 incidents/points in one term, this will be dealt with as a C2 offence (see below). The member of staff issuing the 5th point will email your tutor so they are aware.
- A Category 1 behaviour choice will be recorded on SIMS, worth 1 behaviour point. If disrupting the lesson, you will be given a NET Warning. If you then choose to improve your behaviour, you will not be sent to the NET.
- · Phones will be confiscated.
- The member of staff may discuss your behaviour with you at the end of the lesson or they may decide to issue you with a breaktime or lunchtime detention.
- A Category 2 behaviour choice will be recorded on SIMS, worth 2 behaviour points.
- If you have continued to disrupt the lesson following a NET Warning, you will be removed to the NET and be given a 30 minute after school detention.
- Other choices will be referred to the Curriculum Leader (for behaviour in a lesson) or your Learning Manager who may give you an after school detention (Conduct Card issues will result in an ASD).
- A Category 3 behaviour choice will be recorded on SIMS, worth 3 behaviour points.
- These choices will be referred to your Learning Manager and/or the Deputy Headteacher and/or the Headteacher.
- Depending on the choice and context, you may be given Isolation, Internal Exclusion, a Fixed Term Exclusion from school or in the most serious cases, the Headteacher may decide that you cannot return to the mainstream school.
