

# A level History Induction Work: Cold War Overview

## Welcome!

- Hello and welcome to A level History! We have created a programme of early modern and modern topics to give you a taste of the old and well... a taste of the not so old! To ensure that you are prepared for this experience, the following Induction work has been carefully arranged to give you a taste of what is to come and give you the necessary background to prepare you for our first lesson.

## What work is being set?

- In this first phase, you have been set the following work:
- You can choose to create a OneNote document to house all of your work, which you can share with your teachers and then continue to add to when we start the course or you can compile your work on Word.
- 1. Watch an introductory video about the transition from the Second World War to the Cold War and make some notes on the key features/reasons for transition
- 2. Read Robert Service's article on The Russian Revolution and answer the related questions
- 3. Read Nick Hewitt's article on allied involvement in the Russian Civil War and complete a table
- 4. An extension video is available to learn more about the Russian Revolution
- 5. Construct a timeline of key events from 1917 to 1945, which looks at events leading to the Second World War and its conclusion

## How long should I spend on this work?

- It is expected that you spend 2.5 hours on this first phase of work.
