In phase 2 you will be researching a well-known killer!

On the next slide find the Killer that corresponds your birthday month. In your research you need to:

- 1) Find out as much as you can about their childhood/background.
- 2) Did they suffer any brain abnormalities? How was their personality described? Eg quiet (Introvert) or popular and confident (extrovert) Anything else of note you can find?
- 3) Were they from a marginalised group? And did this impact them? Eg victim of Homophobia? Racism? Abuse?
- 4) What crimes did they commit- when? Why? (if known) Did they 'work' alone or with another?
- 5) What was their MO (Modus operandi, which is Latin for "operating method") What reason did they give for their actions? (if given)
- 6) Did they have a signature? If so what?
- 7) If they were caught? How and what sentence were they given?
