CONCEPTUAL LEARNING SKILLS

Teaching students how to break information into relevant topics and understand how concepts fit together, as opposed to simply rote-learning the material.

STANDING OUT ON ASSESSMENT

How students can distinguish themselves from the thousands of other students being taught the same material.

GOAL SETTING

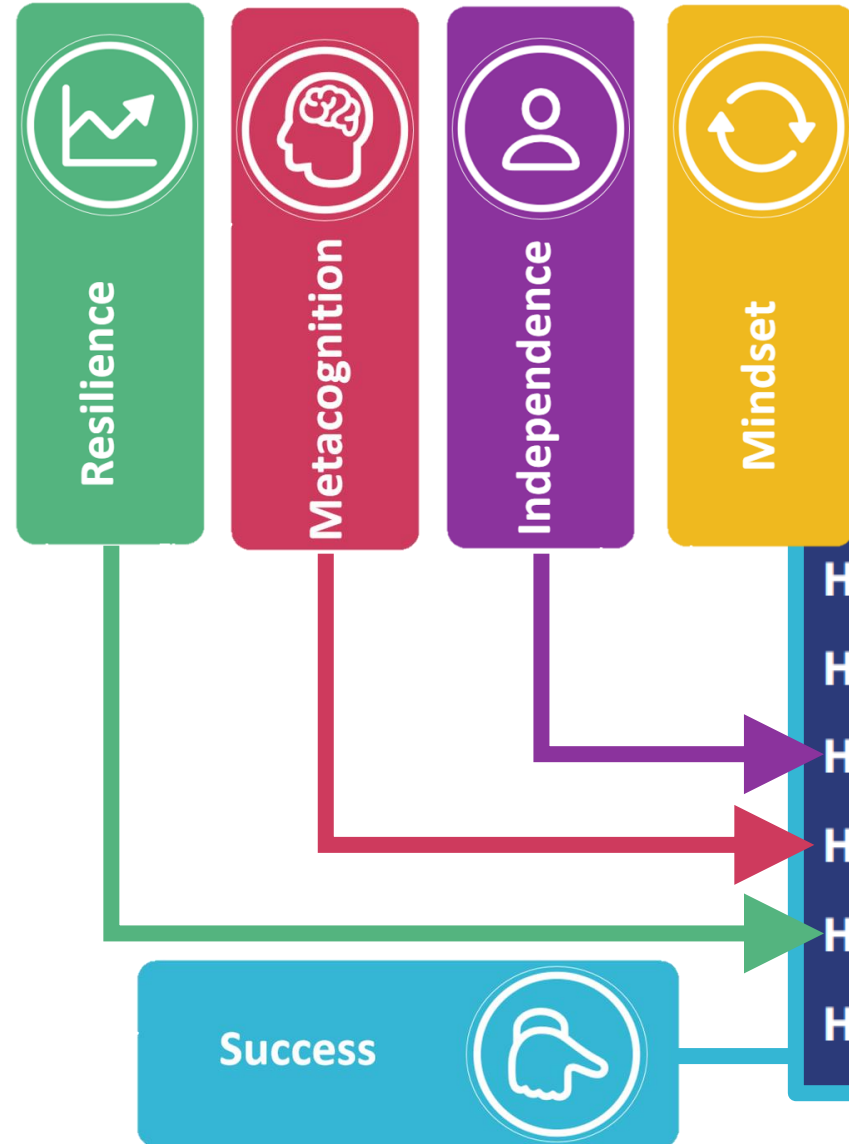
All students are led through a 4-step goal-setting process, helping them to identify unique and compelling reasons to drive them through their final years. Goals are based on the student's ambitions, and include career, university, and vocational study-based goals.

SHORT TERM PLANNING

Once students have identified their goals, they are lead through a short-term planning process to help them break their goal into a series of achievable, short- term benchmarks.

Key points

6 weeks/12 lessons per module.

Students rotate teachers and the topics.

No formal assessments so high expectations.

Relationships, Sex and Health education end of term 2/term 3.

RSE lessons are mandatory as they are part of the 2019 Relationships, Sex and Health Education statutory guidance. Students will not be removed from lessons.

Email will be sent out to parents with list of lessons before RSE module.

One week to revise before mocks then either mocks or revision. April 15th - 26th of April.

Mainly taught by experienced PSHE teachers however we do have some staff outside of the department who I work very closely with and will have specific training.

We also work closely with the SEN department.

Students are not in sets.

In year 11 students will start revising for GCSEs around end of March and only have 3 week rotations.

- **Humanity, charity and ethical living.**

- **Rights and responsibilities.**

Course overview

GCSE Statistics: Exam board - Pearson Edexcel

- **2 exams at the end of Year 10**
- **Exam dates : Weds the 5th June and Mon 17th June**
- **Both papers are 1h 30 minutes and out of 80 marks**
- **Calculator Allowed in both papers**



The Grades

G	F	E	D	C	B	A	A*		
1		2	3	4	5	6	7	8	9

A pass has been set as a grade 4 (the old C grade)

Nationally, approximately:

- Top 20% get a grade 9 - 7
- Top 50% get a grade 5+
- Top 70% get a grade 4+

Hardenhuish 2022/23:

- Grade 9 – 7 = 24.5%
- Grade 5+ = 65.2%
- Grade 4+ = 83.3%



Two Tiers of Entry

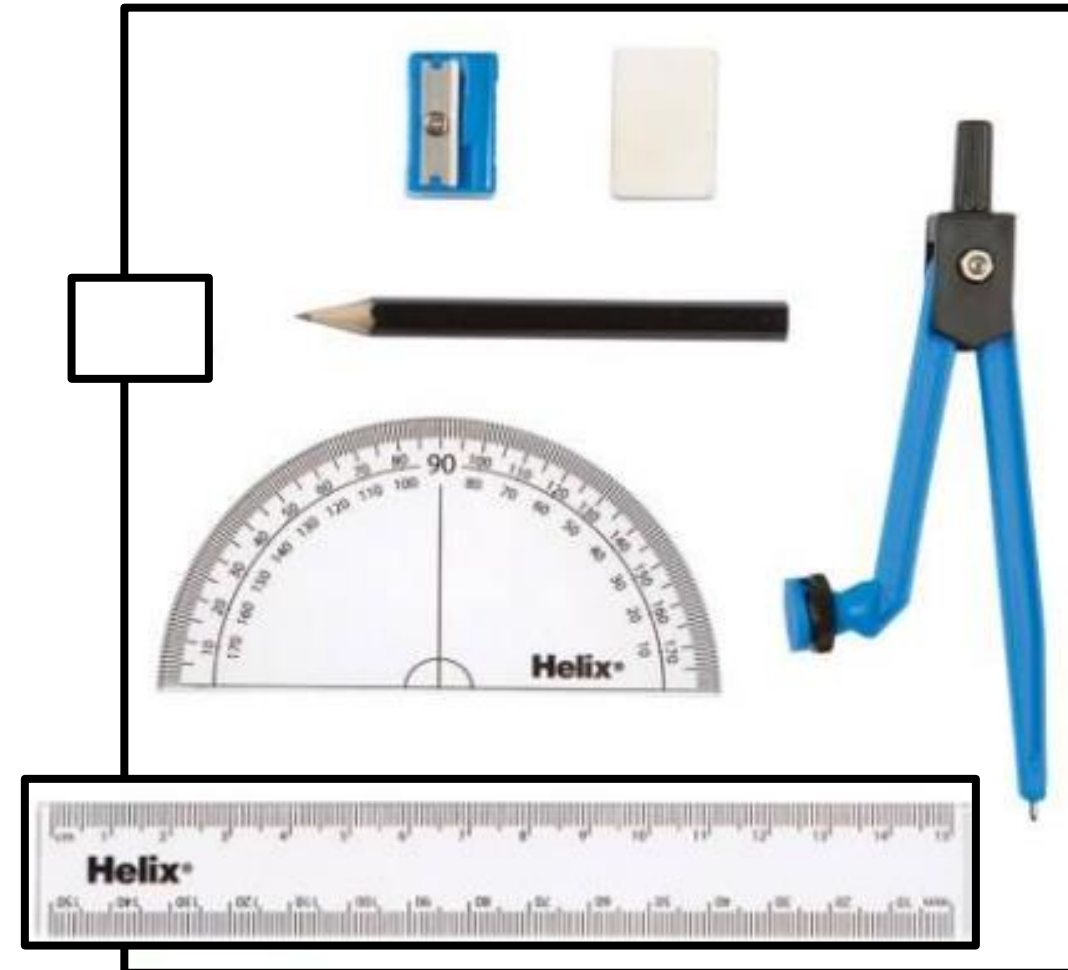
- Higher: Grades 4 to 9
- Foundation: Grades 1 to 5

- Sets 1 - 3 will sit Higher
- Sets 4 - 6 will sit Foundation



Equipment

- Geometry sets are also needed when pupils are asked to measure angles or construct diagrams with a compass.

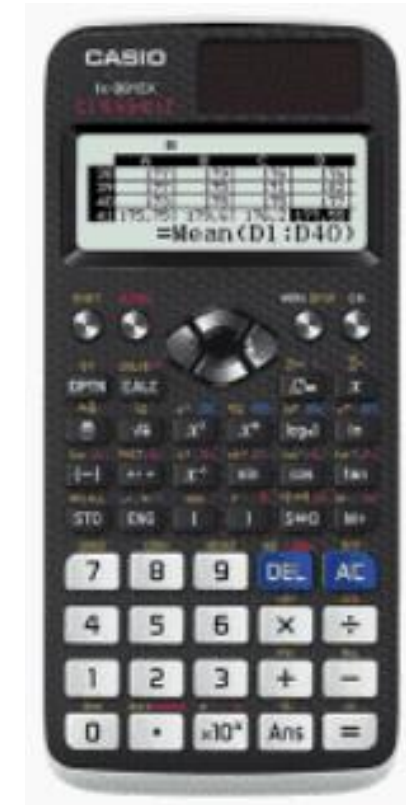
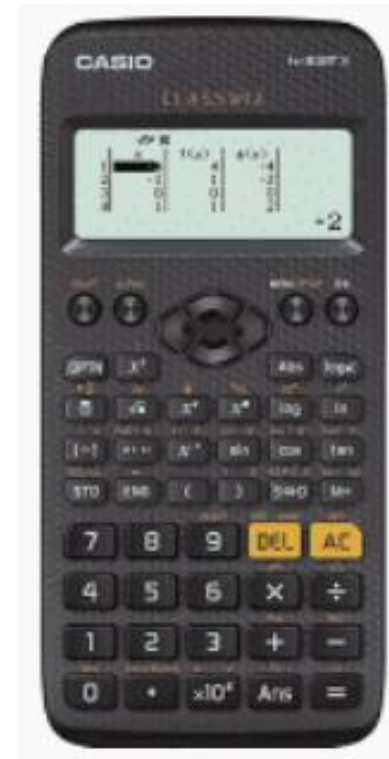

 - Economics

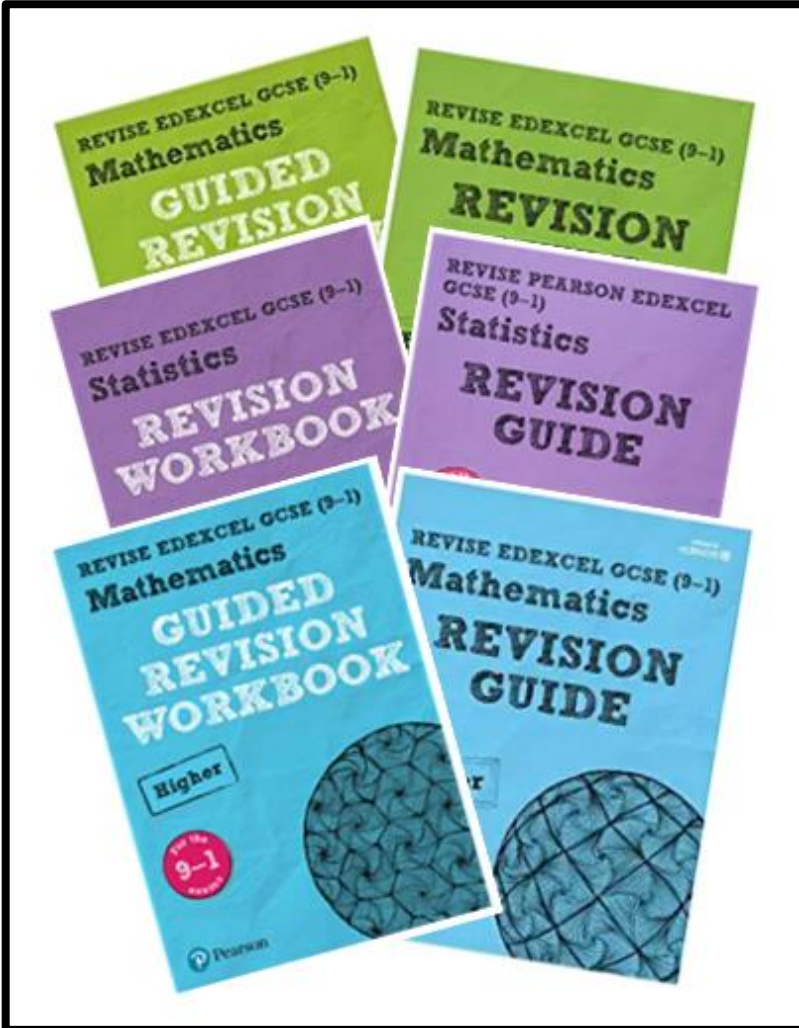


Homework

- Pupils given GCSE Statistics past papers in class once a fortnight, starting in February.
- This will increase to once a week as we approach the exams.
- Past papers will be similar to the GCSE Statistics exams they will sit in June 2024.
- Past papers are essential practice – ensures pupils go over key topics.
- Use notes from their exercise books and other revision aids.



Revision Guides



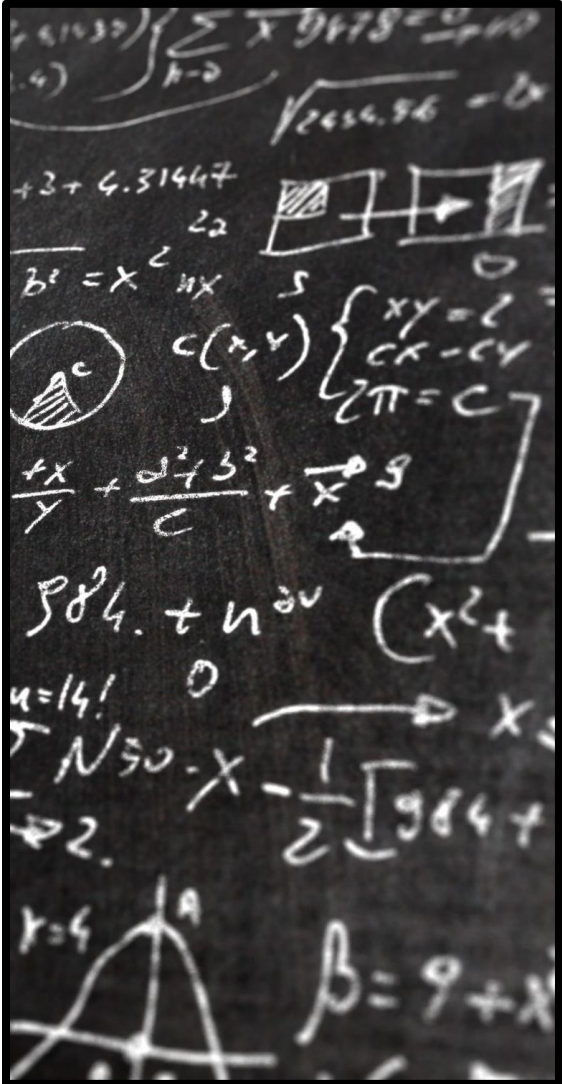
- A letter has already gone out how you can purchase these revision guides through the school.
