Why choose Music?

- ► The approach to topics is largely practical
- ▶ 60% coursework
- ► Lots of choice in the coursework
- Allows students to use their practical skills as a musician to gain a GCSE
- ► Excellent results

Approach to learning

- Building skills in composition starting with group work and moving to individual composing work focusing on individual interests and strengths.
- Ensemble and solo performance opportunities within the classroom and concerts
- New musical topics such as styles of music will be taught via all 3 musical disciplines developing listening skills, performing music of that genre and composing using techniques.




Performing Music 30%

- ▶ Minimum of 4 minutes of solo and ensemble performance (combined)
- Candidates play to their strengths in performance.
- November Year 11 GCSE performance evening.
- Students are marked on:

Mark (total of 36 per performance)	Assessment criteria
6	Levels of demand
15	Technical control (accuracy)
15	Expression and interpretation

Demand

- 6 = Grade 5 standard
- ▶ 5 = Grade 4 standard
- 4 = Grade 3 standard
- 3 = Grade 2 standard
- 2 = Grade 1 standard
- 1 = Below Grade 1 standard



Composing Music 30%

One composition from a choice of composition briefs:

One free composition

- •Film Music, song lyrics, a given melody, chord pattern, a picture etc.
- Any style and instruments of the candidates choosing.

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
A minimum of three minutes of music in total (2 compositions combined) is required
