Key Stage 3 Curriculum - RE / PSHE

PSRE is a combined course encompassing Religious Education, Philosophy and Ethics, and PSHE (Personal, Social and Health Education). In Year 7, pupils receive three PSRE lessons per week, while Year 8 have one and Year 9 have two.

Year 7 pupils are taught in their mixed-ability tutor groups and explore the following key themes in the Religious Education component:

- What's it all about? An introduction to the concept, history, and significance of religion, including an overview of the six major world religions.
- How did it all begin? Exploring questions around how life began.
- Life, death, and beyond! Examining beliefs about the afterlife.
- Hinduism: The World's Oldest Religion. Exploring the beliefs and practices of Hinduism.

As part of the PSHE strand, pupils also study the following modules:

- How can you build your people skills?
 (Covering different types of relationships, friendship, bullying, and cyberbullying)
- What is healthy living?
 (Covering healthy eating, body image, personal safety, and the dangers of smoking)

Each PSHE module emphasises the development of **transferable skills** alongside topic-specific knowledge. Lessons frequently involve **collaborative work**, such as group discussions, and are assessed through classwork and self-reflection activities.

Year 8 & 9 pupils are taught in sets (in agreement with the Geography and History departments). Modules/questions explored include:

In **Year 9**, pupils also have the *option* of studying Law, War and More or Philosophy for the year as one of their KS3 options.
