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1. Definition

The government definition of a bilingual learner is that it refers to 'all pupils who use or have access to more than one language at home or at school – it does not necessarily imply full fluency in both or all languages' (DfES 2003). Diversity of EAL learners.

2. Aims

The school aims to ensure that all EAL pupils achieve:

- 2.1.1. Successful English language acquisition and can use English confidently and competently
- 2.1.2. Access to the curriculum, using English as a means of learning across the curriculum

The school also aims:

- 2.1.3. To ensure that EAL pupils are fully included into the life and work of the School
- 2.1.4. To ensure that pupils whose first language is not English reach their full potential
- 2.1.5. To enhance the self-esteem of EAL pupils by recognising and valuing the importance of home language and culture.

3. Objectives

- 3.1.1. To identify and assess individual pupils' needs as soon as possible
- 3.1.2. To acknowledge the importance of pupils' home language and to build upon their existing skills and knowledge
- 3.1.3. To make use of their knowledge of other languages
- 3.1.4. To ensure parent/carers and pupils are involved in the process
- 3.1.5. To promote a whole school responsibility towards EAL pupils
- 3.1.6. To ensure that appropriate and realistic levels of attainment are decided upon within each curriculum area
- 3.1.7. To make appropriate use of external agencies.

4. Management and Administration

- 4.1.1. Whole School Approach
- 4.1.2. English as an alternative language is addressed in all faculties by subject teachers.
- 4.1.3. Where appropriate, pupils with little English will receive intensive tuition seeking support from EMTAS where applicable.
- 4.1.4. All pupils with EAL are included in mainstream classes as quickly as possible with guidance and support issued to teachers. In-class support will be provided if finances allow.
- 4.1.5. Pupils are encouraged to sit an external examination in their first language to build their confidence to achieve. School will cover the cost of exam entry but (unless in exceptional circumstances) a parental contribution towards the speaking exam would be required.
- 4.1.6. Documentation
- 4.1.7. All documentation and records are maintained by SENDCO (Special Education Needs and Disabilities Co-Ordinator) and are confidential to the parent/carers and to those members of staff associated with the child concerned.
- 4.1.8. Partnership with Parent/carers

- 4.1.9. We aim to work closely with parents/carers of EAL pupils and ensure that they are encouraged to become involved in school activities.
- 4.1.10. Parent/carers will be informed of their child's progress regularly and will be invited into school to discuss any concerns.

5. Procedure

Information will be gathered about:

- 5.1.1. The pupil's linguistic background and competence in other languages.
- 5.1.2. The pupil's previous educational and schooling activities and where appropriate the family's biographical background.
- 5.1.3. The pupil's level of English using the EAL scales.

6. Strategies to ensure access to the Curriculum

- 6.1.1. Referral to external agencies, if necessary.
- 6.1.2. Initial direct teaching to aid acquisition of English.
- 6.1.3. Use of bi-lingual resources, eg, dictionaries, on-line support, Key Word lists.
- 6.1.4. Collaborative group work and peer support.
- 6.1.5. Enhanced opportunities for speaking and listening.
- 6.1.6. In-class support (if funding available).
- 6.1.7. Additional visual support, eg, posters, non-verbal clues.
- 6.1.8. The use of writing frames.
- 6.1.9. Regular feedback from staff.
- 6.1.10. Regular feedback from EAL pupils (Student Voice)
- 6.1.11. Based on individual needs iGCSE in ESL can be offered as an alternative to GCSE English
- 6.1.12. Access for teaching staff to ICT support materials.

7. Monitoring

- 7.1.1. Pupil's acquisition of English to be monitored using EAL scales
- 7.1.2. Pupil's attainment in curriculum areas to be monitored using:
- 7.1.3. Termly PIPs (Pupil Individual Progress Sheets)
- 7.1.4. Discussion with subject staff
- 7.1.5. Annual School Report.

8. Funding

We receive no funding at present from the Local Authority. Relevant funding opportunities will be pursued where appropriate.

9. Resources

A range of resources are used to support a pupil's linguistic development. These include games, differentiated work sheets, keyword lists, bi-lingual dictionaries and computer software.
